The image of Iceland

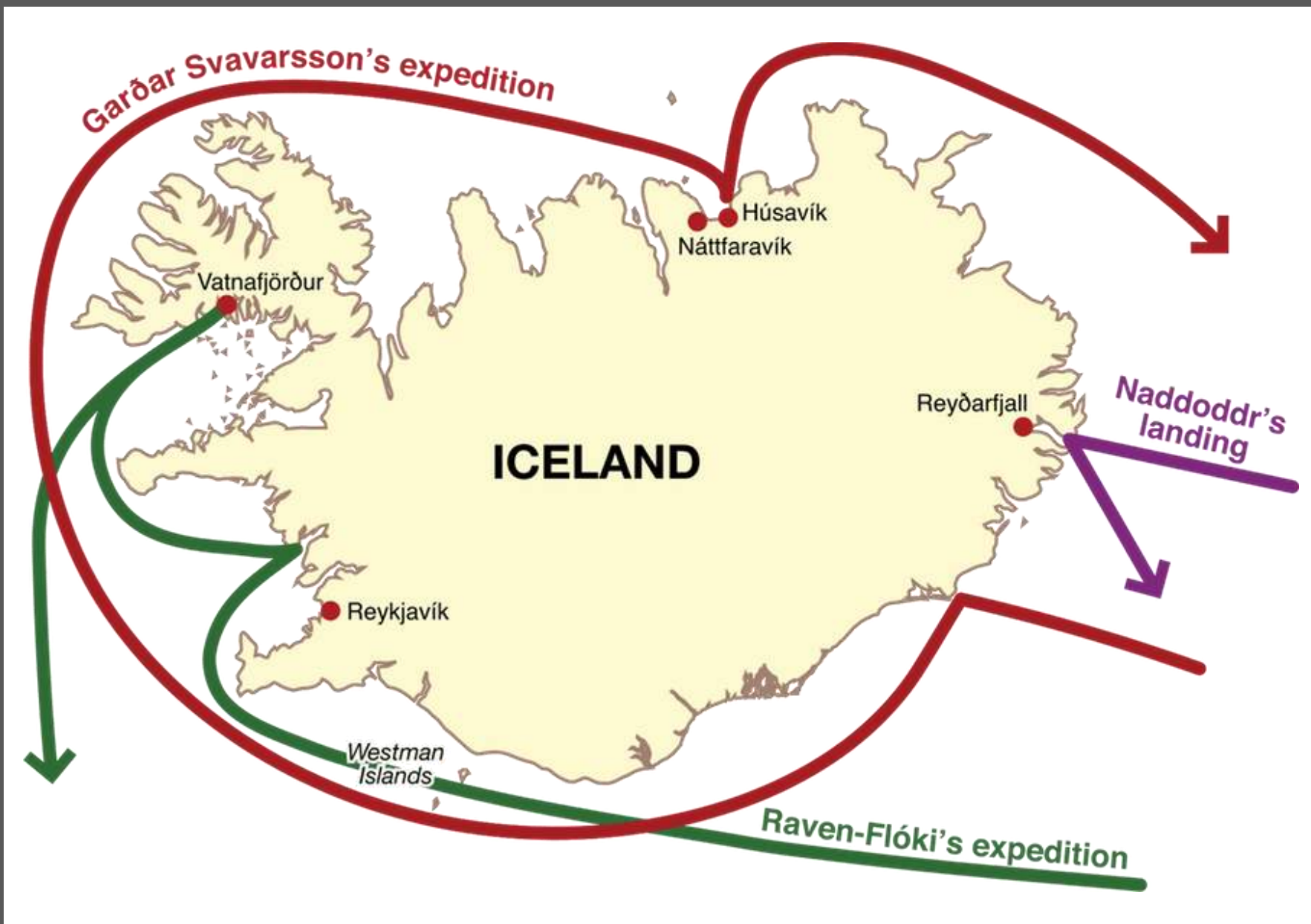
- A European

- The Vikings
 - Norway
 - Celts
- Sailed in open boats with livestock and family
- Settled in lowlands and by the coast
- No central government



The first settlers





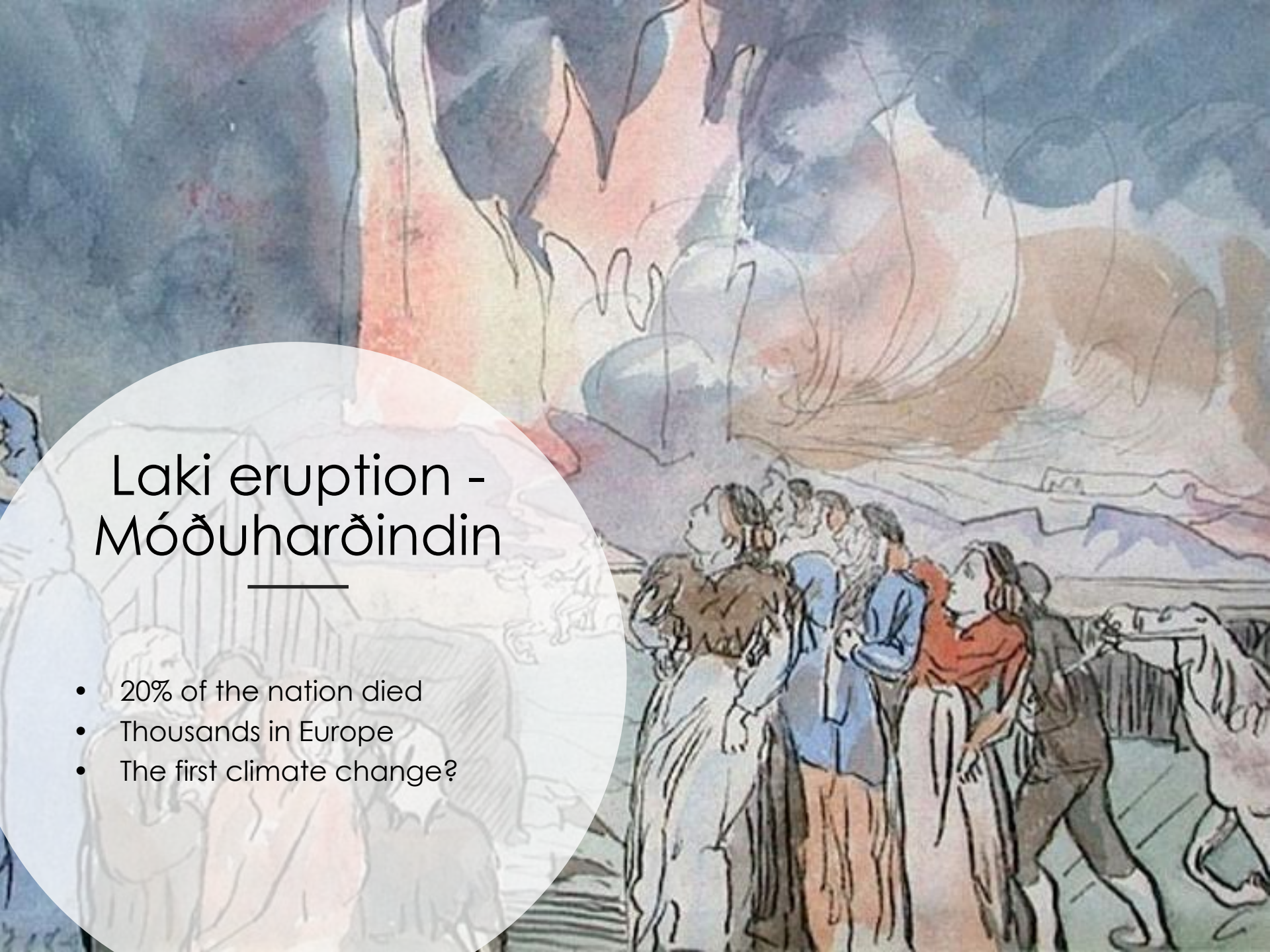
The Saga Age 930-1262

- 930 Althingi - the first Parliament in the world? Located at Þingvellir
- 999 Christianity adopted
- 1120-1230 – The Golden age of writing
- 1220 – Internal conflict - The Age of Sturlungs
- 1262 – Submission for peace



Under foreign rule 1262-1918

- Ruled by Norway, The Kalmar Union and Denmark
- Growing dependency on the foreign ruler:
 - Plaques
 - Climate shifts
 - Law enforcement – Absolute monarchy
 - The Reformation
 - Trade monopoly
 - Natural disasters



Laki eruption - Móðuharðindin

- 20% of the nation died
- Thousands in Europe
- The first climate change?



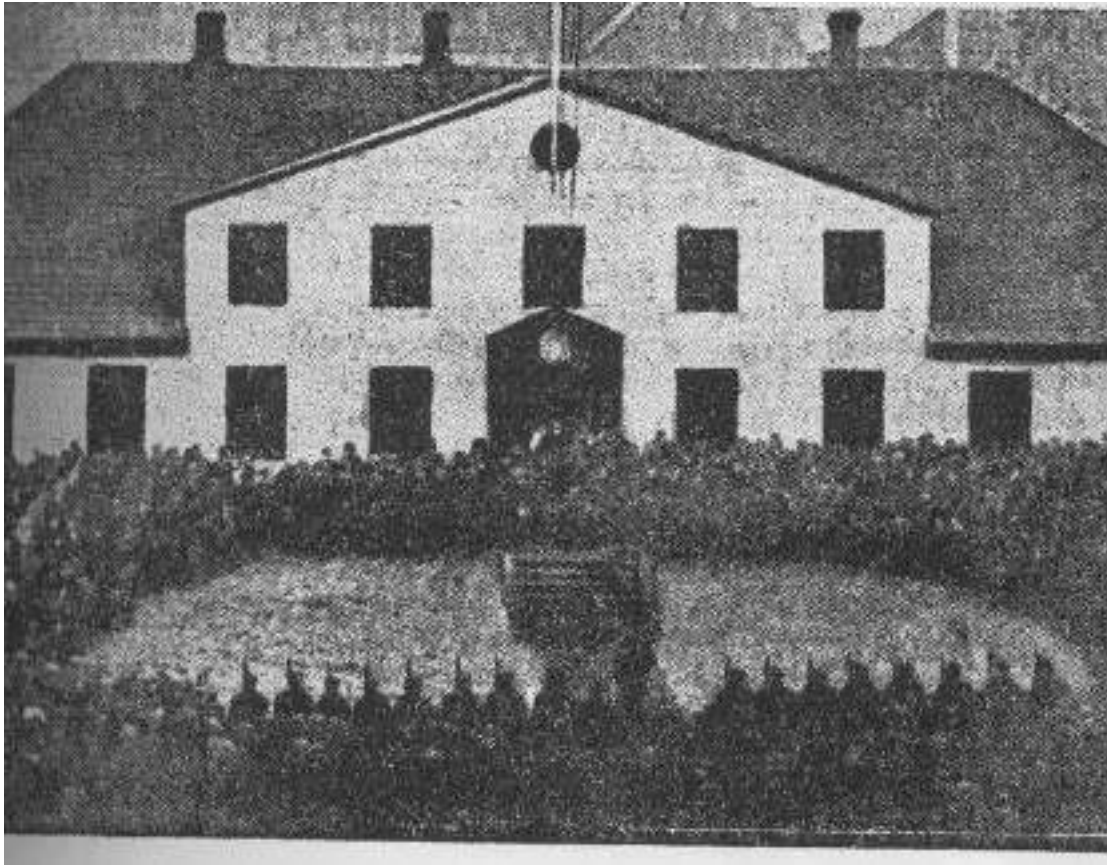
Towards independence

- 1800 – Althingi was resolved
- 1830 – New national consciousness;
 - Writing, handcraft, poetry
 - Independence heroes; Jón Sigurðsson
 - Reestablishing of Althingi



GREAT GEYSER IN ERUPTION, JULY, 1874.

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- 1854 – Freedom of trade
 - 1855 – Freedom of press
 - 1874 – Iceland's first Constitution
 - 1904 – Home rule. Iceland's first minister



1. December 1918

- Iceland became a sovereign state -
“Iceland and Denmark are free and sovereign states in the state of Denmark

Modern day Iceland

- The nation prospered during the 20th Century
 - Fishing and agriculture industries
 - The Marshall Plan
